



Rabbi Weinstock's Message

IF WE CAN'T MOVE ON. WE CAN STILL MOVE **FORWARD**

It was the largest water evacuation in American history. 500,000 people were transported to safety in approximately nine hours by hundreds of vessels that answered a call from the U.S. Coast Guard to converge on New York Harbor to aid in the evacuation. In her book, Rebecca Solnit quotes Professor Charles Fritz, who helped lead the University of Chicago's Disaster Research Project in the 1950's. While conventional wisdom was that disasters bring out the worst in people (think looting or better yet hoarding hand sanitizer) the opposite is much more common.

"The widespread sharing of danger, loss and deprivation produces intimate primarily group solidarity among the survivors, which overcomes social isolation, provides a channel for intimate communication expression, and provides a major source of physical and emotional support and reassurance." Survivors often feel "a feeling of belonging and a sense of unity rarely achieved under In normal circumstances.

Everyone understands that this intense solidarity and altruism is but a "temporary utopian society". Nonetheless, it teaches us something important about the human ability to respond to challenges in positive ways. After the utopia wears off, many people go back to relative normalcy.
