APPRECIATING WHAT WE HAVE AS MOTIVATION FOR OUR FUTURE

However, in the next chapter, Adam names the woman again - only this time he calls her something else: Chava, because she is the mother of all living beings. It must have been clear to Adam from the beginning that Chava was going to be the matriarch of all of humanity, as she was the only female, and Hashem had already commanded them to be fruitful and multiply. Why does Adam first call her Isha, and only after their sin does he name her Chava? Rabbi Baruch Braun explains that due to her sin, Hashem informed Chava of her punishment: giving birth was no longer going to be painless and harmless. It would be difficult, painful, and dangerous. At this point, it was no longer certain that she would willingly participate in childbearing and tolerate the burdens of pregnancy and labor. Before the sin, Chava's role as mother could be taken for granted. Her name didn't need to reflect this role because it could be taken for granted. But now Adam was afraid that his wife would opt out of motherhood. To acknowledge and appreciate her role, Adam created a new name, Chava, which means "mother of all life", to defend the majesty of motherhood and recognize her sacrifice and her ordeal. The lesson is that a person can only truly recognize the value of something when he lost it for a time or is in danger of losing it.


