Rabbi Weinstock's Message:

THE SOURCE OF ALL PROBLEM-SOLVING CAPABILITIES

Compared to the beginning of the holiday, the Seventh Day of Pesach can seem tame, even anticlimactic. Those who are primarily thinking about their first chametz post-Pesach are missing out on the wonder and the timeless lessons of the Shevii Shel Pesach. While we are very familiar with the rituals and customs associated with the Pesach Seders, we may not be aware of the customs for the Seventh Day of Pesach associated with water. Some have the custom to put water in a bowl and jump over it while others have the practice of pouring water on the floor at the dinner table on Shevii Shel Pesach. (Only try this at home with advance parental / spousal permission.) On one level these unique customs may be understood to parallel many of our customs from the beginning of Pesach. Just as we reenact the Exodus through many customs and rituals, so too can we reenact the miracles at the sea on the Seventh Day of Pesach. But it is not merely a reenactment of a past event. It is a reminder of the power of Shevii Shel Pesach for all times. The Midrash Rabba (Shemot 21:6) notes that when the waters of the Yam Suf split an additional miracle occurred in that every single body of water in the world, great and small, also split.

Hashem prefers to allow the world to run according to its natural rules and laws.

“Sometimes all it takes is one moment to change what felt impossible.”

Divine Intervention in the form of miracles is only implemented when necessary to demonstrate something or to teach something important. While we can surmise the need to split the Yam Suf, what possible reason could there be for all of the world's waters to split as well? The Belzer Rebbe explained, based on a pasuk in Tehillim (69:2) **הושיעני יי אלהים כי באו מים עד נפש** “Deliver me, O God, for the waters have reached my neck” that water represents our problems, worries, and troubles that threaten to overwhelm us. When Hashem split the Yam Suf, He also injected within the world a heavy dose of compassion, strong enough to “split all waters,” i.e., to solve all problems, even those most personal and private.

Rav Melech Biderman explains that this idea helps explain a curious word choice. The word used in the Torah to describe the splitting of the sea is the root bekiah as per Shemot 14:16 and 14:21. Yet Chazal refer to the splitting of the sea as **Kriat Yam Suf**. Bekiah usually refers to chopping wood, as we find by Akeidat Yitzchak (Bereishit 22:3) **ויבקע עצה**. Chopping wood is difficult because it creates new pieces of wood from one solid trunk. At that moment in history, in real time, splitting the sea was a beikah. Once Hashem performed this original miracle the capacity for problem solving lives on into the future- even today. That is why in retrospect Chazal refer to the splitting of the sea as a kriah, which is the word used for ripping something that can easily be torn. If we appreciate what Hashem did for us on Shevii Shel Pesach long ago, then we will realize that the legacy of that event is the capacity for Hashem in His infinite mercy to help solve all of our problems today, whether national or personal. All we have to do is believe in Hashem as Problem Solver- and to ask Him for help.
