ON SHAVUOT EACH OF US RECEIVES OUR OWN TORAH

While we think of Shavuot as the celebration of Matan Torah, the Torah itself never explicitly says that. Shavuot is described by the Torah as an agricultural holiday: *Chag HaKatzir*, the festival of harvest. The connection between Shavuot and the giving of the Torah was made explicit later by our rabbinic tradition, who established the language we know so well in our tefillot: *Zman Matan Torateinu*. Rav Yehuda Amital asked: Why would the Torah avoid making that connection explicit? After all, the revelation at Sinai stands at the very center of Jewish history and Jewish identity. The Torah commands us repeatedly to remember that experience. Why not clearly identify Shavuot as the anniversary of Matan Torah? Rav Amital cites the Maharal who explains that had the Torah explicitly designated Shavuot as a celebration of receiving the Torah, it would have created an obligation on us to rejoice in Torah. But genuine joy in Torah cannot be imposed and it cannot be legislated. It has to emerge naturally from within us. The joy of Pesach is more obvious. Freedom from bondage is something everyone equally can appreciate as worthy of celebration. Similarly, the security and protection commemorated by Sukkot is also universally understandable as worthy to celebrate. But the Torah is not quite so obviously worthy of celebration. Torah demands. Torah challenges. Torah obligates. A casual observer may not immediately see Torah as something to celebrate.

Therefore, the Maharal says that the Torah intentionally does not tie our obligatory Shavuot celebration to receiving the Torah.

“True joy cannot be forced — it has to be discovered.”

That connection and realization must emerge organically and individually from each Jew who discovers and experiences Torah learning and Torah living. We are the ones who transform Shavuot into the holiday of *Zman Matan Torateinu*. We live in a time when Jewish identity is often discussed in institutional or communal terms; synagogue affiliation, school enrollment, program attendance, public support for Israel, communal participation. All of those things matter deeply. But Shavuot reminds us that Torah ultimately becomes meaningful only when it is a personalized and personal relationship. The question is not merely whether the Jewish people received the Torah at Sinai. The more relevant question to ask is whether I (and each of you) experience Torah as a gift. Do we feel nourished, challenged, inspired, and elevated by the Torah? Is Torah something I inherit, or something I actively choose? We often say there is a dimension of Shavuot within Yom Kippur,

because the second luchot were given on Yom Kippur. Rav Amital adds that there is also a dimension of Yom Kippur within Shavuot. Like the Day of Atonement, Shavuot requires its own form of reflection and introspection. We must ask ourselves: Have we truly learned to rejoice in Torah? Have we developed a meaningful relationship with it? That question does not have one single answer. For one person, connection to Torah may come through a daf yomi shiur. For another, through parsha study, Jewish philosophy, halacha, chesed, tefillah, or meaningful conversations about Jewish life and values. The beauty of Torah is that it speaks to us collectively as one people, while also reaching each individual soul in a unique way. As we celebrate Shavuot, and as we begin looking toward the summer and beyond, this is an opportunity for each of us to think more deeply about our own personal relationship with Torah and how we might strengthen it. The YIH rabbis and engagement staff genuinely look forward to hearing from many of you about how we can help provide meaningful outlets, opportunities, encouragement and experiences to support and deepen our individual connections to Torah. Ultimately, Shavuot is not only about the Torah that was given once upon a time long ago at Sinai. It is also about the Torah each of us continues to receive anew.

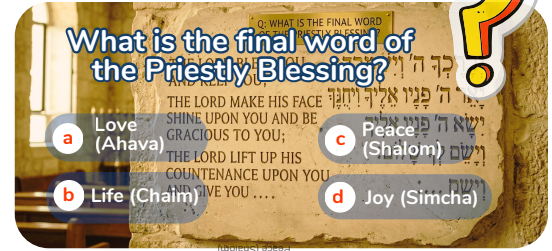

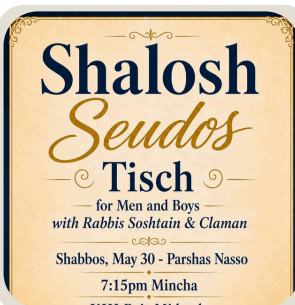
